Contributions for the Magazine have been rather scarce this year, but we wish to thank everyone who did send in something; we hope for an improvement in this direction next year, especially from the Women's Hostel.

Up to the time of going to Press approximately 225 members have paid their current subscriptions, compared with 174 at the corresponding period last year. This substantial increase has been chiefly due to a concerted effort by the committee to increase the membership. Members who had allowed their subscription to lapse were circularised, whilst in addition circular letters were sent to many past students who had never been members of the Association. Members are again reminded that subscriptions become due on the first of January in each year, and should be forwarded on or before that date to the Hon. Treasurer. Considerable doubt appears to exist among members regarding payment for the Magazine. It should be pointed out that in accordance with the Rules of the Association the Magazine is supplied free of charge to all members who have paid their current subscriptions.

Approximately 75 members attended the Annual Reunion Dinner and Dance, and although the number was considerably less than in the preceding year, the gathering was representative of many years of students, and a very enjoyable evening was spent. Thanks are due to the Governing Body and the Principal for again providing accommodation, to Miss Nicholson for the capable way in which the catering arrangements were made and carried out, and last, but not least, to those resident members of the Association who devoted much of their time to the preparations which are essential for the successful issue of an affair of this kind.

The Tenth Annual General Meeting was held the following morning. Officers for the current year were elected, a list of whom appears earlier in this Magazine. 


