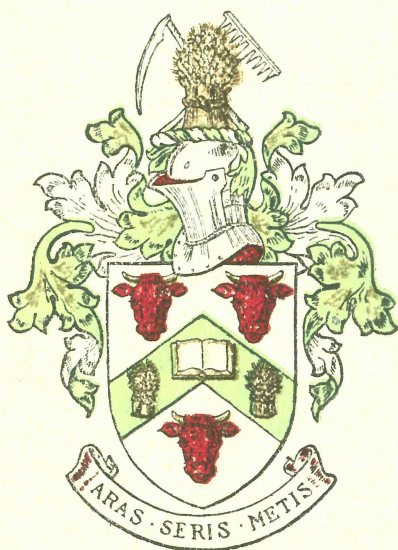

EDITORIAL.

There appear to be two rules for the guidance of those faced with the problem of writing an editorial for the "Kingstonian." The first is that an editorial must be concise, and the second, that on no account should it read like a letter home.

Neither, as you will agree, are of much practical help, since an editorial of this type is essentially a review of the past year's happenings, and as such, must touch upon the more salient features of that year. Consequently, it cannot be made too brief, while its semblance to a letter home is unavoidable.

As predicted in the editorial of last year's Magazine, the cover has undergone some slight alteration, as to colour, rather than design. Whether a permanent or a temporary alteration remains to be seen, but probably the latter, since committees in general are notoriously hard to please.

The year under review has been a very successful and happy one for the College, the numbers of students being well up to the average. It should be rather interesting to note the effects of the Government's present policy in agriculture on both the numbers and types of students at the College in the future, for, if the present schemes and Marketing Boards continue in existence, many hitherto unheard of positions should be opened out for the agricultural student.

An outstanding feature of the two winter terms was the rather serious ragging indulged in, chiefly by the Short Course students, resulting in the usual fines all round. In order to prevent a recurrence of this in the future, the resident Staff, in co-operation with the senior students, have formed a Hostel Management Committee, consisting of six senior members, two junior representatives, and the President of the Students' Association. Amongst other things, the duty of this committee will be to control, to some extent, the social side of hostel life. The successful running of this committee will undoubtedly prove a boon to all Long Course students and others engaged in the intricacies of "swotting."

A lecture on "World Economics" early in the Christmas term inspired a few of the more serious minded students to form an informal Debating Society, and with the Principal's permission weekly meetings were held. The object of the Society was to create an interest outside of College life, and papers on such subjects as "The League of Nations," "The British Constitution," "Japan and the League," and "The Irish Question," were read by the various members of Staff and students comprising the Society. It is hoped that the debates will be continued next year with even greater success.

This session has seen a slight alteration in the time-table of lectures, the mornings now being divided into four periods of fifty minutes each, with ten-minute "breaks." It is generally considered that this may be a blessing, but, if so, it is well disguised.

Further changes have occurred in the Staff this year, Mr. Maw having taken up county work, and Miss Cragg a post at Usk. We wish them both every success in their new undertakings.

New-comers to the Staff ranks are Dr. Gill, Mr. J. Blossom, Miss Jeffrey, and Miss Macmillan, and to these we extend a hearty welcome.

Incidentally, there is some talk of commencing the Magazine earlier in the session than has been the case of late years. An earlier start should certainly allow of earlier publication, and would materially assist the Committee in their quest for copy, as well as giving them more time to devote to their own work.

In conclusion, we should like to wish the College every success in the future, and may the academic and sports results be even improved upon.

Old Kingstonian Association.

Up to the time of going to Press 202 members have paid their current subscription, compared with 235 at the corresponding period last year. This decrease appears to be due partly to the fact that very few students leaving the College at Easter became members of the Association, and partly because a larger number than usual of old members have allowed their membership to lapse during the year. We would take this opportunity of drawing the attention of old members to the new rule regarding Life Membership Subscriptions. Under this rule a member is entitled to Life Membership on payment of £2 2s. od., less a sum of two shillings for every annual subscription he or she has paid. It is hoped that this rule will be instrumental in keeping in the Association many members who would otherwise relinquish their membership.

The Annual Re-union Dinner and Dance was held at the College on December 15th, 1933. Numbers present again showed an increase over the previous year, over 80 being present. Thanks are due to the Governing Body and the Principal for providing accommodation; to Miss Nicholson for the capable way in which the catering arrangements were made and carried out; and last, but not least, to those resident members of the Association who devoted much of their spare time to the preparations which are essential for the successful issue of an affair of this nature.

The Eleventh Annual General Meeting of the Association was held the following morning. Officers for 1934 were elected, a list of whom appears earlier in this Magazine.

The Secretary reported that the Association had made a donation of £5 5s. od. towards the Memorial Fund for the late Dr. King.

The Treasurer reported that the Association was approximately £1 better off than at the corresponding period in 1932.

Members should note that Messrs. F. W. Longmores are no longer outfitters to the Association. Mr. T. Whitmore, The Square, Newport, Salop, has been appointed as official outfitter to the Association, and all communications should be addressed direct to him.

Members will be sorry to hear that Mrs. T. Milburn, the wife of our Honorary President, has been very seriously ill during the year. We are happy to be able to report, however, that, although not yet completely better, she is well on the way to recovery.

Considerable difficulty has again been experienced in raising representative O.K.A. teams to play the Students. The experiment last year in only sending invitations to play in matches to members who had made a definite request to be included in O.K.A. teams has been a failure, and the old method of raising teams has been re-adopted. The general apathy regarding sports fixtures with students is very pronounced, however, and occasions the Sports Secretary much unnecessary labour. In view of this fact, unless a marked improvement takes place during the current year, a proposal will be tabled to discontinue entirely the various sports fixtures with the students.
